She oversees delivery of all programs including all staff. UD is challenged currently due to a "demographic cliff", "institutional density", and fewer students attending college. Darlene shared with us the 3 reasons why she came to Dayton.

- Catholic mission -> promote the principle of the common good
- Special community among the students
- Diversity -> differences make us stronger
- They have focused on affordability to ensure diversity of student base
- They are embracing the role of being an "Anchor institution" for Dayton meaning that the success of Dayton is important to them (economic development, etc.) After answering questions from the group Dr Weaver shared that she is eager to get involved in the community.

The queen of hearts didn't show up so the pot continues to grow. The Four Way Test was recited and the meeting was adjourned.


- You must be present to win and/or purchase tickets (either in person or on zoom)


We all agreed we needed a break from reading sad books about racism and chose a Harry Bosch mystery for a change
