In addition to her volunteer work, she has worked in strategic marketing and product development roles in the technology, legal, consumer, and education sectors. She holds an MBA from Wright State University, an M.A. and M.L.S. from the University of Michigan, and a bachelor's degree from the University of Nebraska. The threatened demise of her one-room country school in Nebraska, an undergraduate summer hitchhiking through Europe, and a year living in Mississippi have contributed to her life-long passion for historic preservation and community advocacy.




We all agreed we needed a break from reading sad books about racism and chose a Harry Bosch mystery for a change.


