Rotary Foundation Month How the Foundation makes help happen?

The Rotary Foundation transforms your gifts into service projects that change lives both close to home and around the world. Since it was founded more than 100 years ago, the Foundation has spent more than \$4 billion on life-changing, sustainable projects.

We do this in several ways:

- **The Power of Light**- A grant helped a club in Durango, Colorado, USA, install more than 200 solar lights in remote, off-the-grid Navajo homes.
- **Healing Thousands**- Rotarian and physician Pia Skarabis-Querfeld has spent years building a network of volunteer doctors to help refugees in Berlin, Germany.
- **Rebuilding Lives**- Rotary clubs worked together to help Puerto Ricans rebuild their homes and hearts after Hurricane Maria.

November 4-10, 2019 is World Interact Month

In 1962 Rotary created Interact, a program for young people 12-18 years old. Since then, Interact has grown to more than 20,000 clubs in 159 countries totally over 460,000 Interactors. Interact members volunteer in their communities, make international connections, and develop leadership skills while making new friends.

- **United States**- Interactors and their sponsor Rotary club teamed up with One World Play Project to bring durable soccer balls to kids in Vietnam.
- **Nepal**- Interactors in Nepal designed an innovative and self-sustaining way to fund their hand washing and hygiene campaign that is keeping younger students healthy and safe.
- **Canada**- For the Interactors at a Canadian school, every day is a new opportunity to feed the hungry and end polio for good.
- **Brazil**- To combat a deadly online game, an Interactor from Brazil creates a game that promotes peace and self-esteem.
- **India**- Mumbai man shares his journey from Interactor to Arch Klumph Society member and tells why he gives to The Rotary Foundation.

Nov. 9th Rotary Day at the United Nations in New York -Rotary Day at the United Nations celebrates two organizations' shared vision for peace and highlights the critical humanitarian activities that Rotary and the UN lead around the world.

Candidates for District Governor 2022-23 -- Request for Applications

Friday, November 22, 2019

We are beginning the search for the Rotarian who will be our District Governor for the Rotary Year 2022-2023. This process ends with the announcement of the new District Governor Nominee Designate (DGND) at the 2020 District Conference.

Rotary International requires that the person nominated will follow a two-year process of training and preparation before assuming the role of District Governor. During the 2020-2021 Rotary year, the selected individual will be the District Governor Nominee (DGN). This role includes observation and training, and participation at District events. It also includes participation at the Rotary Zone 30-31 training institute in Norman, OK October 6-11, 2020, and the All-Ohio Presidents-Elect Training Seminar in March 2020, and participating as a non-voting member of key district committees.

During the 2021-2022 Rotary year, the selected individual will be the District Governor-Elect (DGE). Training and observation activities continue, including participation at the Zone training institute in September or October 2021, and at the Rotary International Assembly (an assembly and training program for District Governors- Elect from all Rotary Districts in the world) in Orlando, FL in January 2022. The DGE will also be the lead District participant for the All-Ohio Presidents-Elect Training Seminar in March 2022.

The elected individual will become District Governor on July 1, 2022.

Our district utilizes a Nominating Committee process. **Interested applicants must submit their completed application to Past District Governor William Shula, Chair of the Nominating Committee, prior to January 13, 2020.** The Chair must review the application to ensure that the required elements are included and that the applicant meets all of the requirements set forth by RI and our District. **Interviews of selected applicants, by the committee, will take place on Wednesday, January 29, 2020, at Wetherington Country Club after 4:30pm.**

Your help in identifying those qualified applicants would be appreciated. Please look within your club and within your Rotary network to identify those Rotarians who met the qualifications and have the desire to get involved at the District level. Feel free to approach he or she or contact Bill Shula, PDG, your Assistant Governor or any other member of the District Nominating Committee and he or she will be glad to reach out and answer all of their questions. The work that we do today will reap benefits for our District, Clubs and Rotarians in the future. Applications are available on the District website www.rotary6670.org under Our District/Nominating. 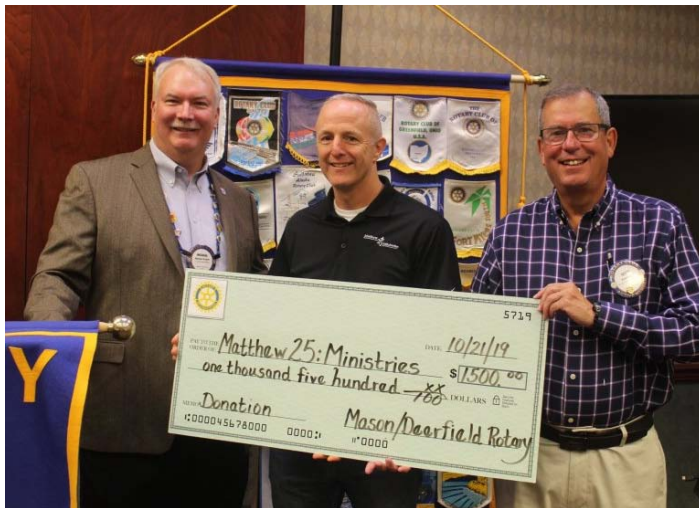

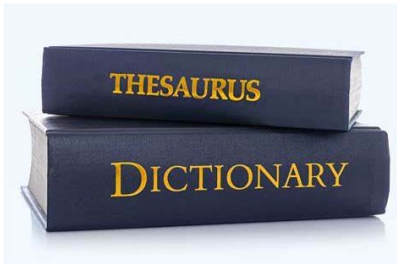
