Rotarians Give Money for Disaster Relief Efforts

The Rotary Club of Dayton, Ohio was in its first year of existence in 1913 when devastating floods hit the region and the aftermath became Rotary International's first ever relief effort. The spirit of Service Above Self lives on in 2019 after 17 tornadoes struck the Dayton area May 27, causing widespread damage.

Rotarian Holly Wiggins, President of the Dayton Rotary Foundation, presents a check to fellow Dayton Rotarian Cory Paul, Local Director of the American Red Cross, for funds raised by the over 200 members of the Dayton Rotary Club along with members of many other District 6670 Rotary Clubs toward Tornado Relief Efforts.

In addition to this donation, District Leadership submitted a Disaster

Relief Grant request in June, 2019 after the tornadoes hit. At the time, The Rotary Foundation had no funds for Disaster Relief. The Rotary Foundation contacted us in early July with the notice that funds were now available and offered a \$25,000 grant for Disaster Relief, the maximum amount available for any Disaster Relief Grant. Since time was short for the District to complete the request, we made telephone contact with several agencies involved in the disaster relief process. Ultimately, the grant was made to assist people in the impacted areas who would need assistance rebuilding their homes. Past Dayton Rotary President Amy Radachi, who is President/CEO of Rebuilding Together Dayton, has been involved with the disaster recovery efforts since the beginning. Her organization will work with low-income homeowners who are under or uninsured to assist in the rebuilding of their homes and our community. Rotarian Rick Schwartz, Chairman of Win Supply, will provide materials to assist in this effort. The project itself will be carried out in September through December. As this is the largest natural disaster since the 1913 flood, it is a large financial commitment for many organizations and requires many volunteers. District 6670 is grateful to be part of the project for the entire Rotary Foundation Disaster Relief Grant of \$25,000.
