Oakwood gets update on Public Radio

The name says it all – *public radio* and that defines the relationship-driven mission of WYSO in Yellow Springs, Ohio. In February at the Dayton Country Club, the Rotary members welcomed Luke Dennis, President, and General Manager for an update on, as Dennis proudly proclaims, "the little station that could." Founded in 1918 by three Antioch students, initially, the station's 19-watt signal could barely cover their campus area.

Today, the 50,000-watt station reaches parts of three states working to be reflective and responsive to the needs of southwest Ohio. WYSO strives to be community-interactive; staff-hosted content features fourteen different local music programs, and topics of local interest along with national NPR programing.

Partnering with comedian and Yellow Springs native Dave Chapelle, WYSO is in the process of repurposing a beloved, former schoolhouse on Dayton Street. Slated to open in July 2024, the new facility will feature a performance venue, classrooms, and community meeting spaces.

WYSO will also expand its footprint in the region by building. The Chuck Berry Studio, a satellite building located in the historic Arcade in downtown Dayton providing reporters a home base to keep up with Dayton's vibrant culture and arts scene.



The History of the Rotary Bell

The History of the Rotary Bell

In 1922, U.S. Rotarians organized an attendance contest; the challenge was that the losing clubs would join in giving the winning club a prize. The Rotary Club of New York City was declared the winner and to them was awarded as a prize a bell from a popular patrol boat, which was placed on wood that came from HMS "Victory", Admiral Nelson's vessel at the battle of Trafalgar. Since then, the bell used in Rotary meetings started to represent, as on the ships, order, discipline and the time to guide us through the weekly hour and a half meetings. The bell informs us with its sound the beginning of the Rotary meeting, at which time people present should stand, same as at the end, in order to salute the national and Rotary flags. The gavel symbolizes the authority invested in the Rotarian elected to the highest position in Rotary, and through him/her reminds those present of his/her authority. When presidents transmit their positions to their successors at the end of their mandate, they give the bell their last hit turning the gavel over to their successor, symbolizing the transfer of authority.
