Within minutes Matt was here with his tool bag. He fixed my downspout temporarily. He fixed a carriage light hanging off my garage. I cannot express how grateful I am to this man, this volunteer. Thank you so very much! I have some work to do, but I think I am better prepared having met one of our everyday heroes right here in our neighborhood. Thank you so very much, Matt!"

Mark Morgan, President of Westerville Sunrise Rotary, provided the following summary of how the club is continuing while maintaining quarantine. Your club may be similar. We share this summary as an example of Rotarians adjusting to the constraints and the needs of their community.

"To District 6690 Leaders,

With everything going on, I thought it appropriate to update the District Leaders on how Westerville Sunrise Rotary is doing during this difficult time in our country.

- We have officially cancelled all of our meetings through May 6, per the order of Governor DeWine. My guess is, we will be cancelling more meetings in May. Time will tell.
- 2. Chilly Open was a success this year. This is our clubs major fundraiser for the year, that is held the first Saturday of February at the Columbus Zoo. The money raised was down this year over previous years, because of some unexpected costs from the zoo and lack of a major sponsor. However, it was still a very successful event with over \$75,000 going to our beneficiaries.

- 3. Our Chilly Open breakfast that was scheduled for April, has obviously been cancelled for this year. This is where we have a breakfast thanking our sponsors and give out the checks to our beneficiaries. We will just be mailing the checks this year along with a letter from our Chilly Open Chair.
- 4. The Club Board has waived payment of our members 4th quarter meal dues. We bill quarterly for meals at \$75.00 per quarter for each member. Since we are not meeting, it didn't make sense to have the members pay. However, because we have managed our club funds wisely, the Club board has agreed to keep paying the salaries of the Wednesday morning Old Bag of Nails staff. Restaurant workers are getting hit very hard now and this was are way of saying Thank You, to the Restaurant Staff that helps us each Wednesday morning.
- 5. We have challenged each of the club members to "Pay-it-Forward" with their 4th quarter \$75.00 meal dues, to a local Westerville Charity. The Club board has agreed to Match any club members donation to WARM, a local Food Pantry, up to a max of \$5,000.00. We have already exceeded the \$5,000.00 match in just a few days. WARM is a very important part of the Westerville Community and their service to those in need is growing each week.
- 6. Last Friday we held the first ever, Westerville Sunrise Rotary Virtual Meeting/Happy Hour over Zoom. We had 43 members that joined in, during some point of the meeting. That is about half of our normal Wednesday Morning meeting attendance, but for a first try, I thought it was a good number. Once individual members learned the mechanics of Zoom, the meeting went very well and very smooth. It was very good to connect with each other, even if it was over our computers. We will be doing that again this Friday afternoon.
- 7. Field of Heroes is being talked about. This is where we put up over 3,000 US flags in the Soccer Fields across from the Westerville Community Center during the Memorial Day Weekend. We are still several weeks away from knowing if the event can go on as we have normally done the last 10 years. For this reason we are working on several different formats for this year's Field of Heroes. We will do something that weekend, it is just too early to know what we can do or should do. Our club can react and move pretty quick to whatever situation we are in at that time.
- 8. Our board members have reached out, and our continuing to reach out, to each of our 135 members to make sure they are all doing okay and if they need anything. So far the members are all healthy and are doing well. Keeping everyone connected is a very important goal of the Board and myself.

That is the highlights to date for Westerville Sunrise Rotary. As I am sure all of you are, we are figuring this all out as we go. In my PETS training last year, they didn't cover how to handle a Pandemic. The Board is staying in close contact with each other, so that is extremely helpful.
