District 6690 Increases Its Donation to Area Food Banks

In May, the Rotary Foundation granted District 6690 an additional \$25,000 in disaster relief funds to address the COVID-19 crisis. That was on top of the \$100,000 raised last month within the district.

"Rotarians are proud to be able add another \$25,000 to our \$100,000 donation made in May," said DG Gary Vaughan. "Our district received the maximum grant amount from the Rotary Foundation which increases the number of people helped to 440,000."

The total \$125,000 in donations will be shared by the Mid-Ohio Food Collective, the Southeast Ohio Foodbank and Kitchen and the Freestore Foodbank in Southwest Ohio.

Update: The newsletter last month credited clubs for contributing to the drive for foodbank funds. Regrettably, **The Rotary Club of Lancaster-Sherman** was omitted from that list. Thank you, Rotarians of Lancaster-Sherman for your contribution!

MORE Food Bank Donations!

We are finding out more every day about District 6690 Rotary clubs that have donated to their local foodbanks, food pantries, and resource centers in addition to the \$100,000 we raised as a district.

Here are the clubs we've heard from:

- The Malta-McConnelsville Rotary Club donated an additional \$1000 to the SouthEast Ohio Food Bank.
- Zanesville Daybreak Rotary donated 4,000 snack bars to Zanesville City Schools. The snack was a special treat in the weekly free lunches for Zanesville students.
- Upper Arlington Rotary Club partnered with National Church Residences and donated Rotary-branded masks to senior residents and staff at the Hilltop Senior residence.
- The Upper Arlington Rotary Club also donated a new freezer along with \$1,000 in food to The Homeless Families Foundation. The donation was made in the memory of longtime Rotarian Bill Mielke.
- The Whitehall-Bexley Club contributed \$10,000 to the Whitehall Food Bank Program!
- The Rotary Club of Hilliard donated \$15,000, volunteered, helped set up processes for managing curbside, sourced difficult to get food, and raised community awareness of the new location for the Hilliard Food Pantry.

District Global Grant

Life Pump Project

In Malawi, 40% of the existing hand pumps are non-functional at any given time. In addition to these broken pumps, research shows another 14,000 communities have water systems that are non-functional during the peak dry season month of October.

Ohio Rotary Clubs in districts 6670 and 6690 will partner with the Bwaila Rotary Clubs in Lilongwe, Malawi on a safe water program serving an estimated 20,000 people.



In early 2019, the ministry of water in Malawi officially adopted the use of a new hand pump technology called LifePump into national policy. This technology, was development by Design Outreach based in Columbus, Ohio. LifePump is able to operate to 150 meters and last 5 years between maintenance cycles and cost 80% less for operations and maintenance compared to other common hand pumps.

Community transformations have been amazing with lower incidences of disease, increased safe housing, increased food production, and kids staying in school. The project includes water, sanitation, and hygiene implementation and training.

District Leadership is challenging each club to contribute \$1,000 or more to this project. (Those funds will be multiplied by District and RI Foundation grants.) The funding goal is \$90,000.
