Urgent Need: A School Bus.

Rafiki Children's Center in Kikuyu, Kenya houses over 75 kids orphaned by AIDS. Rotary began supporting Rafiki in 2004 and to date has received direct contributions from 25 clubs in



District 6690. Today, the orphanage is on a 10-acre sustainable farm for the day-to-day needs of the kids. (includes farm/kitchen, dorms, Rafiki academy, and a medical clinic.)

The bus will allow for additional students from town to attend the school. The bus will also take Rafiki kids outside of the orphanage to experience art, music, live performance, culture and other diverse experiences to allow them to dream big.

Case Breakdown for 2019, endemic countries:

- Afghanistan 13
- Pakistan 53



- Nigeria 0
- Nigeria marked three years since the last case of wild poliovirus (WPV) was detected within its borders. Because Nigeria is the last polioendemic country in Africa, this milestone opens the door for the potential WPV-free certification of the entire WHO AFRO region as early as mid-2020. While this is an important programmatic milestone, the region has not yet been certified

polio-free. Read more.




