(eg kids at doors, the loot you collect for the food pantry, etc) Each club that posts a photo on Facebook will be entered into a drawing. ## Rotary Club of Cambridge Ohio Connects the World!

This year, The Rotary Club of Cambridge is partnering with their local United Way, the sponsor of the Dolly Parton Imagination Library book distribution. The DLIL provides a book every month to children to promote reading and language

development. Recently, 45 kids were on the waiting list and the Cambridge Rotary pledged to sponsor 100 children at \$25 per child. They reached out to local company BiCon, to present the program. BiCon is matching the Rotary pledge and will support 100 children for 5 years!

The Cambridge club also approached local businesses who agreed to contribute money to fund the **Kits for Kids** project; providing supplies to teachers for students who need financial assistance.

Colgate Palmolive Company contributed money for the purchase of trees to be given to school-age kids.

The Rotary joins the local Salvation Army by ringing the bells at Christmas and helping make sandwiches for the summer sack lunch program.

They have also invited local Rotary clubs to join their 1st Wednesday of the month social to promote fellowship.

#### **Urgent Need: A School Bus.**

Rafiki Children's Center in Kikuyu, Kenya houses over 75 kids orphaned by AIDS. Rotary began supporting Rafiki in 2004 and to date has received direct



contributions from 25 clubs in District 6690. Today, the orphanage is on a 10-acre sustainable farm for the day-to-day needs of the kids. (includes farm/kitchen, dorms, Rafiki academy, and a medical clinic.)

The bus will allow for additional students from town to attend the school. The bus will also take Rafiki kids outside of the orphanage to experience art, music, live performance, culture and other diverse experiences to allow them to dream big.




