Rotary Day at the United Nations, which we celebrate each November, is an important reminder of the historic relationship between our organizations. But this year's event is even more important than usual, because we are building up to the 75th anniversary of the signing of the UN Charter in June 2020.



You might ask, why celebrate this anniversary? For Rotary, it is entirely appropriate, because we played such a critical leadership role in the San Francisco Conference that formed the United Nations in 1945. Throughout World War II, Rotary published materials about the importance of forming such an organization to preserve world peace.

Thank you to all countries, to all donors, to all stakeholders, partners, advisory and oversight groups, policy makers, Rotarians. Most importantly, thank you to all communities, to all parents. To all frontline health workers. They are the real heroes of this achievement.

And my **second message is: please do not stop now.** The Reaching the Last Mile Forum, hosted in the United Arab Emirates this November by His Highness Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Crown Prince of the Emirate of Abu Dhabi, will provide an opportunity for many of our stakeholders to recommit their efforts to a polio-free world. I urge all of you to stay committed and redouble determination in this final push to the finish line."

Building On Our Strengths in District 6690

What do we do well in District 6690?

As it turns out, we do a LOT of good as a district!

Representatives from over 20 clubs gathered last month to build on our strengths and create a vision for how District 6690 can better support the clubs and Rotarians that give it that strength.

Rotarians shared personal stories of witnessing the power of Rotary and how it has made a difference to individuals and communities. Those stories formed the foundation for identifying



what and WHY Rotary clubs have been able to make an impact. Strong collaboration, resources, and focus on outcomes are examples of attributes that have been essential to the meaningful projects in Rotary clubs of District 6690.

An entire afternoon was devoted to examining how to amplify those attributes. That is, **what can the district do to help clubs repeat success - or better yet, MAGNIFY impact?**

The group came up with a <u>very</u> long list of ideas, but narrowed it down to a manageable list. Some of the areas of focus were:

- Collaborate on district-wide service projects
- Serve areas that don't currently have Rotary clubs
- Develop future leaders
- Provide a scaled public image strategy
- Help clubs improve retention.

Expect to see a more formal & official rollout in the next few months.




