The Nominating Committee is pleased to announce that Price Finley from the Rotary Club of Upper Arlington, Ohio USA has been selected as District Governor for Rotary year 2022-2023. Please join us in congratulating Price!



Price Finley has been a member of the Rotary Club of Upper Arlington since 2005, and he is a past president of that club (2013-14). He has served as District 6690 Rotary Foundation Chair since July 1, 2016. Price is a Paul Harris Society member and has been a "125 Club" member each year since the inception of that recognition.

From the World Health Organization:

 In Pakistan, transmission continues to be widespread. Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province continues to be of particular concern. The issues include refusal by individuals and communities to accept vaccination, and problems with politicization of the national polio program.



- In Afghanistan, the security situation remains very challenging.
 Inaccessible and missed children particularly in the Southern Region represent a large cohort of susceptible children in this part of Afghanistan. The risk of a major upsurge of cases is growing, with other parts of the country that have been free of WPV1 for some time now at risk of outbreaks.
- In Nigeria, there has been no WPV1 detected for three years, and it is possible that the African Region may be certified WPV free in 2020. (Some good news!)

- Easy Have a member of your Club complete the online RYLA Sponsorship Agreement Form (see links below) confirming your Club's participation in RYLA.
- Indicate the number of students your Club wishes to sponsor on the form and information on your Club's RYLA contact person.
- Note The Club contact will become the main contact for your Club with regard to communications relating to RYLA.

- Once your Club has submitted this form, payment will be due. The cost to attend RYLA remains at \$300.00 per student participant and is paid by the Rotary Club.
- It is then up to your Club to contact and share this leadership development opportunity with your local high school staff/counselors. The school staff can be of great assistance in identifying the ideal RYLA student participant(s) for your Club to sponsor.

Who is a qualified RYLA participant?

- Students must be current High School Sophomores or Juniors.
- The ideal student selected should be someone whose leadership skills may require further development.
- Children / grandchildren etc. of Rotarians are permitted to participate and may be sponsored by your Club.
