Much has changed in the world since 1905. Then, the global population was roughly 1.7 billion. Today, it is 7.7 billion. There were 5 telephones per 100 people in the United States 115 years ago. In 2020, it is estimated that 96



percent of the U.S. population has a cellphone — and both China and India have more than a billion cellphones in use.

Rotary and the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation announced on 22 January that their long-term fundraising partnership, which generates up to \$150 million annually for polio eradication, will continue. Under the



agreement, Rotary is committed to raising \$50 million a year over the next three years, and each dollar will be matched with an additional two dollars by the Gates Foundation.

"The Gates Foundation's longstanding partnership with Rotary has been vital to fighting polio," Gates said. "That's why we're extending our funding match, so every dollar that Rotary raises is met with two more."

The partnership between Rotary and the Gates Foundation has yielded \$2 billion, and Rotarians have given countless volunteer hours to fight polio since Rotary started its PolioPlus program in 1985.



District 6690's PHF Matching Points Campaign

Rotarians Impacting 500+ Second Graders Weekly

Growing up can be tough. Research tells us that 7 in 10 teens think anxiety and depression are major problems for their peers. Students are distracted, under pressure and suffering from mental health issues more than ever before.

The education community is becoming increasingly aware and involved in these issues. In order for kids to be successful academically, their socialemotional needs must be met too.

In 2019, the Westerville Sunrise and Noon Rotary Clubs partnered to expand a character education program that had been used at the second-grade level. Working collaboratively with the Westerville City School Administration, school counselors and elementary teachers - the committee determined which social-emotional skills Rotarians could best reinforce with students.

The updated program was launched this fall in 8 elementary schools by 24 Rotarians. Every week, these Rotarians go to 21 second grade classes and teach 500+ second graders skills such as compassion, honesty, persistence, self-control, resilience, decision making, and healthy life styles.

This collaborative effort between the two Rotary Clubs, the school district, public library, and the business community demonstrates the impact Rotarians can achieve through leadership and volunteering.


