District 6690 Rotarians have answered the call to support the relief efforts in Ukraine and have contributed over \$50,000 towards that effort. This just shows how passionate and dedicated you all are towards peace and to helping to make our world a better place. Though this number is significant, we still have

some work to do to meet our Polio Plus giving goal. If you have not already given, I encourage you to consider giving a minimum of \$25 towards our efforts to eradicate Polio from the face of this earth. If there is still one case there still is the possibility of this devastating and debilitating disease to spread around the world. Certainly, we can understand this possibility from our experiences with COVID. So, I encourage you to help Rotary keep our promise to the children of the world and make your contribution today.

Also, in this newsletter, you will see information about an initiative that evolved from one of our District Conference speakers, MelRo Potter. Her story was a powerful message about the experience a child has in the foster care system. Her story was so moving that we knew we wanted to do something to help make those that are a part of the foster care system a little better. Out of that desire came the idea of a *luggage drive*. During the month of May, which is Foster Care Awareness month, I am encouraging clubs to start collecting new and/or gently used luggage to then give to a local foster care organization in your community. There are over 23,000 Ohio children in the foster care system. And each time one of those kids has to make a move to a new family or facility, most often they have to transport their belongings in a trash bag. Let's help show these young people that they are worthy and that they do matter by giving them a little dignity and providing them with a suitcase of their very own. And to add a little friendly competition, the club that collects the most luggage per capita will be celebrated by a social event sponsored in part by yours truly!

As we approach the end of this Rotary year, let us continue to do the good things Rotarians do. Let's support Our Rotary Foundation so that we can make a difference in our world. Let's grow our organization so that we can build on our network for creating peace. Let us continue to Serve to Change Lives.

In Pakistan, a new case of wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) has been reported from North Waziristan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, with onset of paralysis on 9 April. It is the first reported WPV1 case from the country since January 2021.



## **Help Improve Lives**

On any given day in Ohio, more than 23,700 children are being cared for outside their homes by foster parents. Every community in our Rotary District has children in foster care and as Rotarians, we'd like to do something to help. These children often move from agency to agency and from foster home to foster home, with all their worldly possessions carried in a garbage bag. *Imagine* how valued that makes them feel!

May is Rotary's Youth Services Month and we are asking each club in our district to help improve the lives of these children by **collecting new and gently used luggage**

that you can donate to your local child protection agency. The agency can then distribute these bags directly to each child entering the foster care system. We encourage you to reach out to an agency in your local area now to coordinate this donation and develop a rapport with a local representative for that agency, so that they know your Rotary club is willing to help.

Any size luggage is welcome as usually smaller carry-on size bags are good for younger children and larger bags are

good for older children who usually have more belongings. If you collect cash donations as well, we encourage you to partner with your local Walmart or Sam's Club or Costco or Kohls to actually purchase the luggage as part of your donation to the agency. Speak to a manager there and they will often offer you a pretty good discount if you explain that it's all going to a local charity to benefit foster children. If you can provide a sales tax exempt form from your club's 501(c)(3) foundation, you can save on the sales tax as well.

Our District Governor is helping make this a competitive and fun event by donating \$500 for a happy hour celebration to the club that collects the most pieces of luggage per member in May! The club that contributes the most luggage per club member will have the honor of hosting a happy hour for your club members at a bar or restaurant of your choice, sponsored by District Governor Mary Jane Shackelford (up to a \$500 value)! We will need you to keep track of the number of pieces of luggage collected by your club by completing the attached linked form at the end of May (deadline June 15<sup>th</sup>). A club winner will be announced in June by email and your club will also be featured in the next district newsletter!


