

Another focus of Youth Services in our district is the goal to establish 10 new Interact Clubs.



As I visit clubs and meet with their boards, I am finding a great deal of interest in this initiative. To date, seven clubs are considering pursuing the establishment of a club at a local middle school or high school. A few years ago, the Council on Legislation passed an enactment that made it possible for students as young as age 13 to

be members of an Interact Club. Our district Interact Chair this year is Beth Brockman, whose leadership resulted in the establishment of the first Interact Club in a middle school in District 6710. She is still the advisor to the Calloway County

Urgent Request: Ebola Virus Outbreak

On behalf of District 7600 and the Rotary Club of Hanover County (VA), who has a long-standing relationship with the Rotary Club of Monrovia, Liberia, clubs and Rotarians in District 6710 have been asked to consider providing financial assistance to help protect health care workers and other essential providers in the Ebola - impacted areas of Liberia, Africa. The urgency of this request was underscored by Emile Sam-Peal, President-elect of the Rotary Club of Monrovia, Liberia, who was in Louisville for a missionary group meeting

two weeks ago. While there, PE Emile visited with the International Service Committee meeting of the Rotary Club of Louisville and shared about his club's efforts to help with the health crisis engulfing his country and the outreach from their partner club, Hanover County.

The Rotary Club of Monrovia has initiated efforts to provide support to the Government of Liberia as it faces an unprecedented Ebola outbreak which is showing no signs of abating. This is stressing our already overburdened public health system, coupled with traditional practices and beliefs which are inconsistent with the behaviors required to contain the virus.

We are soliciting support and urgently needed donations to assist the efforts of the Government and aid agencies to ensure health-care workers and burial teams have the required health and safety equipment necessary to continue working.

The Hanover County Rotary has the connections to collect the contributions and then make the donation, which will be accompanied by an agreement for use of the funds, to the Rotary Club of Monrovia. They will, in turn, deposit the cash donations into the Ministry of Health and Social Welfare's dedicated Ebola Response bank account.

If your club is willing to participate, you can make your cash donation checks to 'Rotary Club of Hanover County Foundation', which is a Federal 501(c)(3) tax exempt entity.

Funds Available to "Light Up Rotary"



RI President Gary C. K. Huang established the Rotary Day concept of holding a fun, informal community event for the non-Rotary public to introduce them to Rotary. Rather than create an entirely new event, consider hosting a Rotary event in conjunction with a festival, parade, or other activity in your community that will attract potential Rotarians. The intent is to help clubs drive up interest in membership,

strengthen the relationships with local institutions and community members, and improve Rotary's image in the communities.

To assist clubs with hosting a Rotary Day activity or event, District 6710 is offering the opportunity for clubs to apply for funds by completing a Request Form. Each incoming club president received a brochure about Rotary Day that was prepared by President Huang. You will find ideas and tips in the brochure as well as information about Rotary Days recognition for clubs, how to share photos, and a video contest high

lighting Rotary Day events at the club and district level. Selection of grants will be made by the District Leadership Team.



Ending Cervical Cancer in Haiti

Haiti has the highest incidence of cervical cancer in the world. Several thousand Haitian



women a year are afflicted with cervical cancer. Because Pap smears, pathologists & cancer treatment centers are generally not available to Haitian women, they almost always die, leaving behind orphans. Until now. Through the use of the "See & Treat" method of detecting cervical cancer, ordinary vinegar is used as a screening device to detect cervical cancer in its precancerous stage. When a woman's cervix is swabbed with vinegar, pre-cancerous lesions will turn white, the lesions are frozen and then removed-all in the same day.

The "See & Treat" method, founded in the 1990s as a result of research funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, is being used in Africa, India and Southeast Asia. Now, Rotarians can work with the Women's Global Cancer Alliance (WGCA), founded by fellow Rotarian, Dr. Robert Hilgers, to establish dedicated "See & Treat" clinics in Haiti, beginning in Gonaives.

Many Clubs from District 6710 have joined the Prospect/Goshen Club in making this their International Project for 2014-2015. Through the

matching Global Grant process, it is expected that Rotary will provide significant funding for the Gonaives clinic over the next year as well as funding to begin the process of working on future sites. Someday, young teens will be vaccinated to prevent the HPV virus that leads to cervical cancer. But we can stop the dying

now. To be a part of the beginning of the end of cervical cancer, contact <u>Jo Ann Heppermann</u>.

Effective with the **January**, **2015** dues invoice from Rotary International a new method will be used to prepare the invoice. It will reduce the amount of paperwork you will complete, but will require membership information to be updated regularly online at DacDb or at Rotary.org.

If your club is NOT using DacDb as its database this would be a great time to do so. There is no extra charge

to use the basic membership module as your district dues help pay for this. In addition, by opening the "information pipeline" between your club, DacDb and Rotary International, you can save time and trouble.

Global Scholarship Opportunities Available

District 6710 and The Rotary Foundation are offering a prestigious Global Scholarship of \$30,000 or more for a year of graduate study (2015-16) at a

university overseas. The Global Scholarship is for college seniors, returning Peace Corps volunteers, and graduate students who are already studying overseas. To qualify, candidates must be from or studying in District 6710.

Colleges within District 6710 and all grant qualified clubs in our District are strongly encouraged to identify outstanding students and encourage them to apply. To be eligible for a Global Scholarship, a candidate must present a master's or doctoral plan of study and career plans that concentrate on one or more of the six humanitarian Areas of Focus of the Rotary Foundation:

- Peace and conflict prevention/resolution
- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development

Global Scholarship candidates are required to submit application material to a grant qualified club in our District. Clubs will then interview candidates and decide whether or not to forward their nomination to the District Scholarship Committee. Clubs may forward application material for up to two candidates each year. **February 7, 2015** is the deadline for submitting completed applications to Kirk Alliman, Chair of the District's Scholarship Committee.The Committee will interview finalists on March 7, 2015 in Elizabethtown.
