- First impressions really, really matter. This starts with your website/Facebook page, and the paper materials you have available. They should be up-to-date and reflect the fellowship, service projects and fun present in your club. To prospective members, the care and feeding of your web site communicates your club's engagement and commitment to service. If it's out of date, think what that communicates about your club! Remember that there's some wonderful resources-including brochures, photos, and logos-available to you through Rotary Brand Central (https://brandcenter.rotary.org/en-GB).
- When your club greets a prospective member at a meeting for the first time, make sure they really feel welcomed by the entire membership. Assign a specific club leader—one who clearly shows off his or her excitement about Rotary-to provide information and make joining the club an "easy" process. Every club member should be able to communicate what's great about their club why they continue being members. Can everyone answer the "what's in it for me" question?




