District Global Scholars Nominated

2018-01-30

Sponsorship from District 6710 and the Rotary Foundation, 2018-19 marks the fourth (4) year of the District 6710 Rotary Global Scholarship program.

In January 2018, the District 6710 Rotary Global Scholarship Committee solicited and received applications from seven (7) outstanding candidates for the scholarship. The eight (8) member Scholarship Committee was tasked to interview each candidate, and then select up to two (2) who would be nominated to the Rotary Foundation for the two \$45,000 scholarships. Each of the candidates was endorsed by a grant-certified Rotary Club in District 6710, and was required to have been accepted for admission for post-baccalaureate study from an overseas university/college.



Final nominations to the Rotary Foundation will be made in late January 2018.

Foundation Receives Highest Rating From Charity Navigator

For the 10th consecutive year, The Rotary Foundation has received the highest rating — four stars — from Charity Navigator, an independent evaluator of charities in the U.S.

In the most recent ratings, the Foundation earned the maximum of 100 points for demonstrating both strong financial health and commitment to accountability and transparency.
