"To be able to receive a District Grant - or to nominate a Global Grant Scholar, or take part in a Global Grant - clubs need to re-qualify every year. This means having at least one member (two if your club was NOT qualified in 2017-18) attend a Grant Management Seminar, and submitting a signed Memorandum of Understanding to the District."

33 clubs were represented at on-line seminars or those held in combination with Pre-PETS sessions in November and December. Three new on-line sessions have been scheduled for January and February.

The Rules for Debate

Speech Limits in Debate: You may speak in debate twice on any debatable motion on the same day. Each time, you may speak for up to ten minutes. Special rules may be adopted setting other limits; such changes can only be done by a two-thirds vote. Time cannot be given from one person to another, neither can one "yield the floor" to let someone else speak on their time.
