ANNUAL FUND GIVING CONTINUES TO GROW

As of May 31, our giving to the Annual Fund SHARE is \$79.74 per Rotarian (Goal is \$100.) In 2018 our year end giving was \$94.72. Thanks to the 1081 District Rotarians who have contributed so far this year. (40% vs goal of 50%).
