Rotary Rumors

Once more we were called to order by James Gallimore, our President-Elect, who in turn called upon Roger Reichmuth to get us started, who deferred to Asia Burnett and Michelle Bundren, who lead us in song with Jayne Crisp at the ivory keys. It was joyous! Apparently James eschews the limelight because he wasted no time in calling Keith Travis to the podium with an important announcement. As is our custom, a coordinated conduit for our response to those in need due to the most recent hurricane is being proposed. Our District Governor is in touch with the District Governor of the area most impacted by the flooding and damage as a result of Hurricane Michael. Unsurprisingly, there aren't sufficient facilities to warehouse the goods that might be sent by the well intended; nor are the logistical centers up and running. Instead, what would work best is the flexibility of cash to support those in need and bolster their local economy. So, our District Governor has asked that over the next two weeks, which is to say by Thursday the 25th, each Rotarian within the district contribute \$20. Some may not be in a position to do this, while others might be prepared to give more; but if we average said amount then our District would be able to send \$27,000. Keith is coordinating the effort for the entire District. It was immediately suggested that the "plate" be passed at our meeting and that a similar protocol occur during the meeting on the 25th. It did not take long for \$612 to be gathered and handed over to Keith Travis, the Assistant Governor of the District. The goal is to send the collection by November 1st. Roger Reichmuth rose with gravitas and assumed the role of Sergeant-at-Arms. His effort was thwarted not by shoddy research but by absenteeism. Nonetheless, he persisted. Numerous blessings were delineated during Happy Dollars.
