Rotary Rumors

As we approach the mid-point of the 2018-19 Rotary Year, the Rotary Club of Murray has contributed \$2,920.00 to the Annual Fund. Our goal is \$14,600. We have contributed \$1,820.00 to the Polio Plus fund. Our goal is \$2,000. We should exceed our goal for Polio Plus by the end of December. Our club has added four new Paul Harris Fellows since the 1st of July, 2018. The club now has 282 Paul Harris members since January 1st, 1974 (PDG Nat Ryan Hughes). We have added one new Paul Harris Society Member since 1st July. The club now has four Paul Harris Society members. (A Paul Harris Society member pledges to give \$1000 per year to The Rotary Foundation as long as they are able.)

Thus far nearly thirty Rotarians have pledged or given to the campaign to raise funds for Phase III of the Rotary Amphitheatre Project. At this point, we need \$10,000 to achieve our objective. A bit more will enable the Project Committee to purchase some additional equipment. This structure, which is becoming a landmark within the park, advances so many of our goals as a club. The wholesome activities produced on this outdoor stage support caring conversation, commerce, and community development. With the matching grants in place, an investment in this close to completed endeavor will be money well spent! See Roger Reichmuth to learn more about how you can help.

Over twenty Rotarians, spouses, and members of MSU's Rotaract joined another twenty plus volunteers at the Sleep in Heavenly Peace Build-a-Bed Construction Day on November 17th. We wrote a successful grant for over \$5,100. As you know, our personal gifts to the Rotary Foundation make such grants possible. This grant supplied sufficient material to construct seventeen complete bunks, fifteen of which were built on Saturday. From the grant we were also able to purchase bedding for an additional eight beds, thus extending our service to 42 children. Anyone who desires to help with the delivery of a bed should contact Diana Thomason. Two Rotarians may be needed for a delivery scheduled for December 8th.

Fifty Rotary and Rotaract volunteers fed approximately 400 people on November 10th. With your dues as a member, we cleared around \$3000. A big shout out to Coy Samons for allowing us to use the Murray Middle School Cafeteria, Wanda & Leah for helping us maneuver around the kitchen, Mike Harland & Shaffer Coffee Company for supplying the coffee, and The Murray Bank for sponsoring the Tom Rushing Memorial Ham Breakfast.
