Stace Karge from the Crossville Housing Authority --New Beginnings program gave an inspirational program on both the New Beginnings program, and preconceived perceptions on people that impact our society today. New Beginnings is a self help program to assist families in building their own homes with help and assistance

from New Beginnings staff and subcontractors. Homes are 1400 sq ft with 3 bedrooms 2 baths and a 2 car garage and a typical family ends up having to make loan payments of \$500-\$600/month for their home after all adjustments. Participants put in a lot of effort to attain a good credit score and to save money to put into the home.

Having received a phone call from a neighbor to the recent development underway saying that people are moving out because of the “riff-raff” moving in Stacey challenged us all to help change the conversation with preconceived stereotypes. Her clients have good credit scores, solid savings plan, good jobs, and are committed to have a home for their family.



Frank Horvath gave an up-date on the Music & Memory Program that FG Rotary initiated in 2015 and the plan forward to expand program with M&M Certified facilities and expansion into more facilities using a clinical monitored and measured

District Golf Tournament held at Heatherhurst on June 30



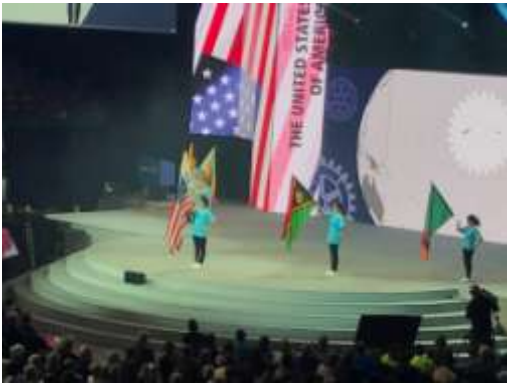
