Chief Mike Williams gave an overview of our full service Police Dept. There was a significant reduction on criminal activity in the last year. The "house watch" program has saved residents a lot of money by observing and helping to correct damage do to freezing and accidental damage that would have led to additional damage in addition to peace of mind and crime deterrence. The value of the Car Fit program and Neighbor Watch Program was highlighted. Contractor fraud is now a major effort and has been getting the guilty punished. Expectation is that it will be a Nationally Accredited Police Agency in May which will reduce the likelihood of law suits since proper procedures are followed and hence liability insurance rates will be lower. It is unusual for private police departments to be accredited and this will help recruit officers.
