Last week's meeting



Jim Young spoke about the History of Palace Theatre which was built in 1938 for about \$38,000 at the time. It served as movie theater and event center and played an important role in fund raising and support for war efforts in WWII. It continued as a theater until it closed in 1978. It deteriorated over the years,

eventually losing its roof. Efforts to restore the theater began in mid 1980 but didn't get traction until mid- 1990's.

Downtown Crossville, Inc. (DCI) spearheaded the efforts to save the theater in the 1990's. The City of Crossville purchased the Palace Theatre property in 1993 and in 1994 the theatre earned a listing on the National Historic Register.

In 1996 the Crossville City Council approved a bond referendum



that was approved 2 to 1 by the voters. That bond issue needed to be supplemented by Grants and donations to complete the restoration to the Palace Theater we see today. Restoration totaled almost \$900,000 (\$600,000

Bond Issue, \$234,000 Grant plus donated work and funds) and was completed in 2001.
