

Rotarians To Honor Its Int'l President At Ceremonies Here

The Lebanon Rotary will be one of many area Rotary Clubs represented at a special event at Cumberland University designed to honor former Tennessee Lieutenant Governor and International Rotary President James L. Bomar Jr. of Shelbyville.

Bomar is to be the honoree featured at the Frank G. Clement Dinner Friday night, an event held annually by Cumberland in honor of the late governor, an alumnus of the school.

Bill Heydel, president of the Lebanon Rotary, said the club's board of directors voted last week to purchase tickets for one table at the event in honor of the former International Rotary president.

"James Bomar well exemplifies the meaning and tradition of Rotary. His record of service to Rotary International and to the State of Ten-

nessee makes him most deserving of the honor he is to receive Friday night.

"It is in this spirit and for this reason that our Rotary board has voted to participate with other contributors in the Cumberland University Frank G. Clement Dinner," Heydel said.

Heydel explained that former local recipients of the distinguished International Rotary Paul Harris fellow award and their wives will be the guests at the club's table.

Bomar, a 1937 graduate of Cumberland, served as Speaker of the State Senate as well as Speaker of the Tennessee House of Representatives.

He is a member of the Cumberland University Board of Trust and currently serves as a member of the Cumberland Law School advisory board at Samford University in Birmingham.
