

Historic Induction for the Rotary Club of New Tampa Noon and Rotary District 6890!

On Thursday, September 4th, 2019 The Rotary Club of New Tampa Noon inducted 14 new Rotarians! This, alone, is cause for celebration. The occasion also put District 6890 into "positive territory" for membership growth in the current Rotary year. But, most importantly, the new club model created by this historic induction is believed to be the first of its kind *ever* in Rotary!

Our community-based Tampa Rotaract Club has been active in our district for several years. They are sponsored by the Rotary Club of Tampa. In the interest of helping to bridge the gap between Rotaract and Rotary, PDG Vinnie Kudva and the Rotary Club of New Tampa Noon offered Tampa Rotaractors a unique opportunity: Join New Tampa Noon Rotary as active Rotarians, and immediately form an alternative-format satellite club. Twelve Rotaractors, roughly half of the Tampa Rotaract Club, accepted the challenge.

Under the new structure, Tampa Rotaractors and newly inducted New Tampa Noon Satellite Rotarians will meet jointly once per month, continuing the same schedule as Tampa Rotaract. Additionally, the group will host another monthly alternative-format meeting, to comply with Rotary International requirements for clubs to meet at least twice per month. The secondary gathering may be a leadership meeting, service project, strategy session, social event, or web-based interactive meeting.

This is an exciting opportunity in District 6890 and throughout Rotary! Our new club model provides a logical entry point for young business professionals, while creating a very direct pipeline for members to progress into Rotary. The Cost of Being a Rotarian

Travel from one club to the next and you will get a wide variety of answers. In truth, there are three primary factors that contribute to membership dues. First, Rotary International and Rotary districts each charge administrative fees (for D-6890, combined, about \$125 annually). Second, clubs usually cover the cost of sending their future leader to the annual President-Elect Training Seminar (PETS). The approximately \$300 registration charge is typically spread across all club Rotarians such that a club of 30 members would include \$10 in their dues; for a total of \$135 in "external" Rotary costs. Additional value comes only from club experience.

Value may be added by holding meetings at a unique venue, offering exceptional quality meals, hosting extraordinary speakers, or otherwise providing "worth" in the eyes of the membership. Value means different things to different people and it is unlikely that all will agree on a single definition. Each club must ask and answer the question for themselves: *What do we offer of value to justify the cost of being a Rotarian?* For most of us, value is measured – with varying degrees of importance – in networking opportunities, service experiences, friendship cultivation, and leadership development. Is your club a bargain for the investment you are asking people to make?

Membership Resource Spotlight

The *Club Health Assessment* on Rotary6890.org is a 12-page questionnaire that includes diagnostic suggestions to improve club effectiveness and engagement. Questions may be distributed to club members in survey-like fashion, or simply reviewed by club boards or membership committees. The key is to honestly evaluate club elements and formulate action where it will have greatest impact.

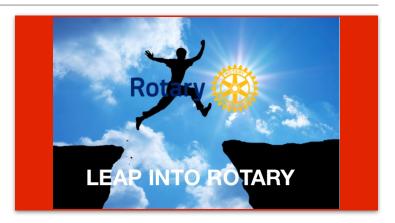

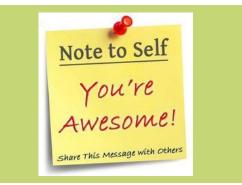
