Suddenly, We're All Members of "Alternative Meeting Format" Clubs!

Rotary clubs around the world are scrambling to develop and deploy communication strategies to minimize risk of the COVID-19 pandemic. There are a number of commonly used web conference services. Among them, www.Zoom.us seems to be very popular and user-friendly. There is a FREE version, but it restricts group meetings to 40 minutes. There is an upgraded version for \$14.99 per month that offers greatly increased meeting services. You may find that one of your club members already uses the enhanced version through work and can schedule your meetings (free for participants). Because many clubs meet at different times, groups might also consider pooling a subscription among several clubs.

Now is the time for Membership creativity. Now is the time to explore resources, share ideas, and engage differently. It is also a time to be strategic and deliberate. Consider how to reach members who may not be comfortable with web-based technology (most web conference tools allow for dial-in access). Consider one-on-one contact with individuals who may need it. And, most importantly, take care of yourselves and those around you.

Learn More About the Rotary and Toastmasters International Alliance

Earlier this year, Rotary International announced a new strategic partnership with Toastmasters International. Much like the evolution of RImandated club bylaws, the alliance appears to have very few, if any, rules. Briefly examining the Toastmasters website, it appears they have very similar individual club autonomy to Rotary. Most Toastmasters clubs meet monthly. According to Toastmasters.org, dues are only \$90.00 per month, though clubs may charge differently, depending upon how they are structured. This time of "social distancing" may be an ideal time to make contact via phone or email and explore possible mutual interests. What about a group that concentrates on Rotary initiatives three weeks per month, and public speaking and leadership once?
