It is true that most of the clubs in our district also have never done an international project. Many clubs think that doing an international project is difficult. But in reality there are only very few simple steps to do an international project.



What makes a project "international"?

Any activity that promotes better understanding of and appreciation for other cultures is considered an international project. Often these projects involve members of your local community, while others can benefit communities halfway across the world.

How does a club decide what kind of international project is best for the club?

Consider both your resources and the interests of your members when choosing a project. Brainstorming is a great way to put your ideas into focus.



How to Finance International projects?



There are basically two ways. 1) International projects with matching funds from the Rotary Foundation. These are called as Global Grant projects. 2) International projects without matching funds from the Rotary Foundation. You can use District Grants or cash or supplies.
