

<u>Understanding Foundation</u> <u>Recognition Points</u>

What are Foundation recognition points and how can I accumulate them? Foundation recognition points are awarded to donors who contribute to The Rotary Foundation through the Annual Fund or PolioPlus, or who contribute to sponsorship of a Foundation grant. Donors receive one recognition point for every US dollar contributed to these funds. Contributions to the Endowment Fund are not eligible.

How are Foundation recognition points tracked? Your club and district leaders can view the online Club Recognition Summary, which includes the recognition amount, tally recognition points, current Paul Harris Fellow level, and date that level was achieved. Through your MyRotary account, you can view your person contribution recognition history, and available Foundation amount. recognition points.

What recognition opportunities are available with Foundation recognition points? Paul Harris Fellow recognition is extended to any individual who contributes, outright or cumulatively \$1,000 or more to the Annual Fund or PolioPlus or as sponsorship of a portion of a Foundation gift.
