POLIO UPDATE

No new cases of Wild Poliovirus this week. There now have been 12 reported cases of Wild Poliovirus year to date in 2018 as compared to 7 cases at this point in 2017 and an eventual 2017 total of 22 Wild Poliovirus cases.

9 of the cases this year have occurred in Afghanistan and 3 in Pakistan.

A look back at our history as we celebrate our 50th Anniversary!

The Rotary Club of Lakeland South was led by Tom Sheridan, an investment advisor, in its third year. Tom was big on attendance and made "Increased Attendance" the theme of his year. Apparently, the message got across because attendance exceeded 90% on the year! Tom Sheridan was followed by Ralph Blalock, a banker, who led the club during the 1971-1972 Rotary year. The club began selling Christmas trees as a fundraiser on a lot that was manned by club members. Also, Lakeland South challenged the Zephyrhills Rotary Club to a three-month attendance contest that LSR won. (The club had 100% attendance two of the three months.) There was a \$250 prize for the challenge that was used to fund a club party at Cleveland Heights for members and their wives. Additionally, the club had its very first Paul Harris Fellow when Ray Hubbard reached the \$1000 threshold for giving to the Rotary Foundation.
