Lawuratu Musah-Saaka is a versatile and results-oriented development professional with over 15 years of progressive experience in project management, monitoring and evaluation (M&E), strategic planning, regulatory affairs, and public service leadership. She is currently pursuing a PhD in Organizational Management with a specialization in Political Marketing at NiBS University. Her academic credentials also include an MBA in Project Management and a BA in Psychology with Philosophy.

Throughout her career, Lawuratu has played instrumental roles in Ghana's public sector. At the **Ministry of Health**, she served with distinction as Monitoring and Evaluation Officer and Administrative Manager. In these roles, she coordinated donor-funded health projects, tracked infrastructure delivery across the country, monitored sector-wide performance, and supported high-level national events such as Health Summits, Holistic Assessments, and Annual Reviews. Her work significantly contributed to data-driven decision-making, stakeholder coordination, and the effective use of external aid from partners including the World Bank, JICA, and ADB.

At the National Cyber Security Centre now the Cyber Security Authority, Lawuratu was appointed as Child Online Protection Lead, where she successfully developed and coordinated the implementation of Ghana's National Child Online Protection Framework. She led stakeholder engagements with international development partners including UNICEF, the Global Alliance for Child Online Safety, and the Internet Watch Foundation. Under her leadership, Ghana launched its IWF Reporting Portal and introduced nationwide awareness and capacity-building initiatives for child safety in the digital space.

In governance, Lawuratu has served as **Deputy Executive Secretary of the Postal and Courier Services Regulatory Commission (PCSRC)**, where she led the Commission's regulatory, operational, and strategic agenda, and ensured robust consumer protection frameworks. As a **Board Member and Chair of the Audit Committee** of the Ghana Publishing Company Limited, she championed governance reforms and financial accountability.
