- complete all Mandatory Objectives, and
- complete the Elective Objectives requirements (based on the club size) per Elective Categories in Leadership, Membership, Foundation, Service Projects, Public Image, and Youth Service.

The Elective Objectives Requirements:

- Small Clubs (1-29 members) must complete three (3) elective objectives.
- Medium Clubs (30-59 members) must complete four (4) elective objectives.
- Large Clubs (60-90 members) must complete five (5) elective objectives.
- X-Large Clubs (91+ members) must complete six (6) elective objectives.
