

# Rotary Short Term Youth Exchange


The Rotary Youth Exchange Program is an amazing learning opportunity. The local program is open to students ages 15 to 18 ½ who live or attend school in Rotary District 6910, which includes 65 clubs and more than 3,400 members in the North Georgia.

The District 6910 Youth Exchange Program involves a highly competitive application process. Application and information packets are available online at [www.rotarydistrict6910.org](http://www.rotarydistrict6910.org). Students will need to devote time and effort to ensure their application best reflects their accomplishments. Students are strongly encouraged to apply as soon as possible. Applications are reviewed and interviews are held at the local Rotary Club level. Selected candidates are then recommended





## Where will you be this summer?

Paddling Lake Como in Italy or exploring the coast of Spain?? Or perhaps touring the Black Forest in Germany or visiting Copenhagen in Denmark? These adventures and others await students who participate in the Rotary Youth Exchange program, which typically runs late June through mid-August.

### Youth Exchanges vary

Youth Exchanges vary in length, group size and theme, depending on the host country and the structure of the exchange. For example, outbound students from Rotary District 6910 will stay abroad for three weeks with their host families. Foreign students then return with U.S. students. Each part of the exchange will last about three weeks for a total commitment of six weeks during the summer.

### Summer Program

Past Rotary Youth Exchange programs included travels to Germany's Black Forest region, northern Italy's Lake District, Denmark, Sweden and Spain.

Countries vary from year to year. Students from the U.S. will stay with host families.

### Costs vary depending on destination

Basic food and lodging expenses are provided. Students are responsible for

program fees, airfare and medical insurance, which can range from \$1,500 to \$2,000 depending on the destination, and any additional entertainment and emergency funding based on their parents' discretion. In previous years, an allowance of \$200 to \$500 has been sufficient.
