

What is a Classification Talk?

A Rotary Classification Talk is designed to be very brief, approximately 5 minutes. In a nutshell, this is a chance for new members to tell us the important parts of their personal and professional life - not all the story, but just enough that we can begin to ask questions.

Here's a few ideas on items to cover:

■ Vocational

- What's your profession?
- What do you do in your role?
- Why did you choose your particular business or profession?
- What parts of your job do you find most rewarding and most difficult?
- What kind of education and experience are required to get into your vocation?
- What was your journey to where you are in your profession today?

■ Personal

- What brought you to this area if you were not born here?
- Talk about your family—if applicable, your spouse's name, where you met, how long you've been married, number and ages of children, etc.
- What are your hobbies and special interests?
- Share Interesting travel experiences (for business or pleasure) or any other experiences that might be of interest to your fellow Rotarians.
