<u>Dave Shoaf</u> discussed the District Membership, Foundation, Future Visions Seminar – to be held in Vero Beach on Saturday, November 10, 2012 Larry Lavargna, Jane Mills and Dave are attending.

The Happy and Sad Dollars discussion was led by <u>John Gonzalez</u>, filling in for Rock. The highlight was a generous hundred contributed by Rex Sentell, coupled with a motion to donate today's collections to Rotary's Superstorm Sandy New Jersey New York relief efforts. Ultimately more than \$900 was contributed by many generous Rotarians!

Our Guest Speaker was Dorothy Drummond of Terre Haute Indiana, and author affiliated with National Geographic. She discussed her book "Holy Land Whose Land?" She spoke of her three visits to the Holy Land and her quest to determine why three cultures have their roots and claims to Israel. After giving a talk, a Syrian engineer told her he agreed with everything she said except her goal of peace. He said "the only way to achieve peace was to push Israel into the sea, then we will have peace." She showed a photo of Arab leaders from just a few years ago, virtually all are already gone. She spoke of the "Arab Spring" and our administration's support for the Muslim Brotherhood, which wants to go back to ancient times, Shania law, no national boundaries, one Umah, ruled by a Caliphate, as it was in the 7th Century. Its slogan: "Islam is the answer." President Morsi, the leader, is an engineer trained at USC, who has said he won't get rid of Israel, "he knows better."

Obama said Israel had to go back to 1967 boundaries, "the green line." Israel will make concessions but not go back. Palestinians will accept nothing less. The result is an impasse. Ms. Drummond: "Obama's efforts have taken us back from likely resolution to impasse."
