Where are we now?

The Stuart Sunrise Rotary Club meets weekly at 7:30 AM on Thursday mornings. There is great energy and camaraderie among the club members. Locally, the club raises money for several scholarships for county high school seniors, and other causes identified throughout the year, including several hundred dictionaries for third graders. Internationally, the club has sponsored the AK' Tenamit school in Guatemala. One of the club's strengths is its commitment to youth avoing sponsored Rotakids for elementary school children, attendees to RYLA, and, this past year, both outgoing and incoming exchange students. In terms of weaknesses, the club has had some challenges in using My Rotary in terms of setting goals in order for our efforts to be tracked and measured. Also, recently the Club has lost several members of long-standing, due to health, job or family conflicts.

Where do we want to be? We want to increase our membership to about 60 to increase our level of service activity.

In addition, at a Board retreat at the beginning of the year, two priority areas of interest were identified: youth and working with other clubs. This led us to articulating a vision for the club for the

What is our vision?

Our vision is to serve youth by teaching them leadership skills and the value of service. We seek to do this in both non-traditional and traditional ways, both locally and internationally.

Locally, we would like to find ways to serve and support youth of all ages, particularly in ways that teach them about service. For that reason, we want to do the following:

- Spend time and resources maintaining and growing our Rotakids program.
- We want to start an Interact Club at Clark Advanced Learning Center.
- We want to look for opportunities to work with the Rotaract clubs in the District.
- We want to invite members of the above groups, and other Youth organizations, to work with us on community projects and attend other Rotary activities.
- We want to strive to influence, mentor, and recruit minority youth into Rotary projects and programs.
- We want to continue to distribute a Dictionary to every Third Grader in our club's area.
- . We want to send 4-5 High School students to RYLA.
- We want to prepare to sponsor incoming and outgoing exchange students again sometime in the near future.
- We would also like for our Foundation to have enough resources to sustain giving levels of about \$10,000 per year.
- We want to work with other clubs to identify ways to increase our mutual resources to be a gift to the world.

Internationally, we would like to serve youth where there is a need, even if in non-traditional or creative ways. For this reason, we are looking at supporting the following efforts.

- Join with other clubs to support Ak' Tenamit Capital Projects which would install rest rooms and other plumbing in the Girl's dormitories at the school in Guatemala.
- · Support at least one scholarship at Ak' Tenamit.
- Possibly continuing to support the soccer project in Africa.
- Look for a new project that teaches service above self to youth in other countries.
