## **Center for Constitutional Values**

Gene introduced Kate Boland to the club. Kate has served as an executive in State and Federal government as well as VP at the National Association of Homebuilders. Since moving to Hobe Sound she has become active in the Martin County Chamber Leadership class 25, was past president of the Martin County Republican Party and serves on the board of directors of Habitat for Humanity and is one of the Founding members of the Center for Constitutional Values.

The group's primary program is an Education and Scholarship Program to help students improve their knowledge of the Consitution and challenge them to demonstrate their understanding of its meaning and relevance today.

The Center developed and created a major high school program to raise the awareness of key issues affecting all our lives. Using a debate format the Center offered student teams at the 4 high schools in Martin County a debate competition. Each team had to be ready to debate either side of an issue of constitutional importance from today's news. The first debate was won by the team from Martin County High and Clark Advanced Technology Center. The 2 teams faced off at a debate at City Hall in Stuart. Winner of this debate were recipients of college scholarships.

The Center also sponsors a speaker series open to the public that brings noted scholars and thoughtful commentators to our community to discuss the Constitution and current policy issues.
