Make Your Yard a Certified Wildlife Habitat With Judy Kizner By Martine Kallemeijn

Judy (and husband Dave) Kizner was kindly introduced by our member Jen Reed. They own the Wild Birds Unlimited Nature Store since 5 years after their retirement from being a teacher. According to Jen, the store is truly a bird-lovers paradise! You can buy anything related to the support of birds in your yard, including stickers to put on the windows to ensure they do not fly into the windows.

You can even certify your yard to become a Real Certified Wildlife Habitat! Judy and Dave have partnered with the local wildlife federation to save, a.o., the songbirds. This bird population unfortunately has decreased with 2.9 billion breeding birds in the last 50 years. So therefore they are committed to make people's yards certified for helping these birds.

Judy told us that in order to certify your yard you need to have five elements: water, food, shelter, sustainability and a place for the birds for breeding.

Food: you need three sources of food, which can be a mix of native plants and feeders. As an example, you can use two feeders and one plant, or two plants and one feeder - as long as you have those three sources. The feeder can be like a humming bird feeder, seed cylinder, tray feeder, etc. Tray feeders are by the way very popular, as the birds have a great overview of their environment to check for predators.

Water: one source of drinking water is enough. This can be like a stream or a shallow dish. Additionally you would need a birdbath. Make sure it is elevated so that predators cannot reach the birds while taking a bath.

Shelter: a native plant could provide shelter for birds, and it can additionally be a food source. You can also have a hollow log or birdhouse.

Breeding space: you would need two sources for raising the young, for instance with a bluebird house, or something similar such as a roosting box or even bat houses. Ensure that you have a proper birdhouse, this will prevent the issue of birds falling out of the nest, entry of predators and the probability to move the nest because it was built at an inappropriate spot in your yard. Some birds are known to build nests in very weird places! Some birds really do not care and build nests even in pockets of jeans, or within garages (Judy named these fun examples of crazy birds). So make sure you have birdhouses, that will then be their first choice and you would not have to move the nest (which disturbs the habitat).

Sustainability: finally, you need to do some work on practices on e.g. soil and water conservation, grassland, controlling exotic species (put native plants in your yard!), keeping your cat indoors, and other organic practices to prevent the usage of chemicals.

If you can do all the above, you can easily apply for the certification. You could even upgrade yourself with a sign in your yard with the official certification!
