



Rotary Club of Boca Raton Sunrise Foundation Teacher of the Year

The Teacher of the Year event began in 1987 as just a dream of Sunrise Rotarian and current Palm Beach County School Board Chairman Frank Barbieri, starting with just four teachers from Spanish River High School, Loggers Run Middle School, and Coral Sunset and Whispering Pine Elementary Schools. Since that time over 700 teachers have been awarded this prestigious honor throughout the greater Boca Raton community.

Each year the Rotary Club of Boca Raton Sunrise has recognized outstanding teachers from the current twenty-three public schools in the greater Boca Raton area. Over the years the event has grown with a greater number of sponsors, underwriters, local and Congressional dignitaries, and guest. It has attracted the attention of local media.

This year guests will be treated to an exciting evening of cocktails and heavy appetizers, provided by the West Boca High School (WBHS) Academy of Culinary Arts, live music from the Spanish River Jazz Ensemble and opening ceremonies from the Olympic Heights High School Color Guard. This is all followed by video presentations of the twenty-three teachers, awards, along with keynote speakers. Following the awards ceremony guests will enjoy desserts also provided by the WBHS Academy of Culinary Arts and the melodic sounds of the Boca Raton High school Choral Group.

The event is being hosted by the newly branded Studio at Mizner Park located in Mizner Park and is being held in Partnership with the Boca Raton Chamber of Commerce Golden Bell Education Foundation.

- Supporting Education More than 775 million people over the age of 15 are illiterate. Our goal is to strengthen the capacity of communities to support basic education and literacy, reduce gender disparity in education, and increase adult literacy.
- Growing Local Economies We carry out service projects that enhance economic and community development and create opportunities for decent and productive work for young and old. We also strengthen local entrepreneurs and community leaders, particularly women, in impoverished communities.
- Polio Eradication Rotary is a leading partner in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. With help from our partners, the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, the World Health Organization, the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and UNICEF, we have made the world 99.9 percent polio-free.
