INTRODUCTION

Officially adopted by Rotary International in 1971, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is one of the most significant and fastest-growing programs of Rotary service. Each year, thousands of young people take part in the program worldwide. The impact spreads further as the program influences other young people, and RYLA programs often lead to the formation or strengthening of Rotaract and Interact clubs.

Leadership, Citizenship & Personal Development - RYLA is an intensive training program for community youth leaders. Each spring, 10th - graders chosen for their past service to the community and leadership potential are awarded an all-expenses-paid camp to discuss leadership skills and to learn those skills through practice.

RYLA AIMS:

1. Demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth
2. Provide an effective training experience for selected youth and potential leaders
3. Encourage leadership of youth by youth
4. Publicly recognize young people who are providing service to their communities

RYLA Seminars:

Awardees attending the RYLA seminars can expect to further develop their personal and leadership skills in the following key areas:

1. *Communication Skills*: Participants will have the opportunity to: develop interpersonal skills; communicate, listen and write more effectively; engage in some form of public speaking in a warm, supportive environment
2. *Personal Qualities*: Participants will have the opportunities to: identify the various types of personality; help people to get along with each other; manage their own time more effectively; avoid stressful situations; plan for healthier living
3. *Leadership*: Participants will have the opportunity to: identify the characteristics of effective leaders; become aware of the various styles of leadership; observe effective leaders operating in a meeting situation
4. *Problem Solving Strategies*: Participants will have the opportunity to: brainstorm and think creatively; engage in practical problem solving and decision making activities; use a problem solving model in a practical situation

Timeline:

OCTOBER – DECEMBER 2018: RYLA applications are distributed to nominees. Nominations from teachers are solicited via the MEMO TO TEACHERS (in RYLA selection packet). Rotary clubs commit to a planned number of students and send appropriate tuition total to Rotary District 6940 Foundation in C/O RYLA Chair. Print: RYLA and # of slots sponsored in notes field of the check bottom left.

DECEMBER 1, 2018: YOUR CLUB COMMITMENT IS DUE!!! Please email Olevia McNally at ryla6940@gmail.com with the number of student RYLarians and/or ALUMNI you agree to support. You will be invoiced at a rate of \$300 for each commitment. Please include the club contact with contact information along with an email where the invoice can receive prompt attention.

JANUARY 2019 – FEBRUARY 2019: Applications are received and reviewed by Rotary clubs. Interviews are scheduled. Students are selected.

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April 25-28, 2019

MARCH 1, 2019: Complete applications of selected students are sent to RYLA Committee.

APRIL 1, 2019: Final transportation arrangements are made.

APRIL 25-28, 2019: RYLA

Cost to Clubs: Tuition is \$300 per each student. Clubs must make check payable to Rotary District 6940 RYLA and mail to RYLA Chair by December 31, 2018 (Club President initials ____). Transportation costs varies with travel distance and is not part of tuition. It is your club's responsibility to arrange transportation for your sponsored students (Club President initials ____). **Please make club checks payable to Rotary Dist. 6940 (note RYLA on memo line – bottom left of check) and send to Olevia McNally, District 6940 RYLA Chair, 130 Chipley Avenue, Pensacola, FL 32503. Questions about payments? 850-380-0465**

Transportation: Each Rotary club is responsible for getting their students to RYLA. Most clubs coordinate transportation with other area clubs to car (van) pool. Some clubs utilize church vans and personal vehicles. Other clubs rent vans from vendors such as Enterprise. In the past, the average fuel/van cost for rentals has been \$60 to \$70 per student. By initialing her you are acknowledging that you will arrange transportation for your sponsored student and that you will email the District RYLA Chair and Transportation Chair the contact information and details of transportation plan by March 2018 at ryla6940@gmail.com (Club President initials ____).

SELECTION PROCESS

Since there is wide-spread agreement among Rotarians involved with RYLA in District 6940 that the success of RYLA is, in a large degree, affected by the type of student selected to attend, the RYLA Organizing Committee adopted the following recommended selection process on July 24, 2004.

1. First, RYLA is SPECIAL and should be presented as an AWARD for past service or demonstrated leadership potential. Instead of indiscriminately blanketing a campus with RYLA applications, nominations from all teachers of 10th grade students should be solicited. Through the use of the one page MEMO TO TEACHERS, the optimal RYLA candidate (i.e. an emerging achiever in need of a little boost) can be communicated to teachers so a quality field of candidates can be assembled.
2. Once a group of students have been nominated by the teachers, a Rotarian and a RYLA graduate should do a short talk about RYLA to the field of candidates. RYLA talks are most effective when pictures of past years are available.
3. After the meeting, the RYLA two page applications should be distributed to students who continue to be interested.
4. Once applications are returned, short 10-15 minute interviews should be scheduled with the students. In this way, your club will be able to make quality selections based on first hand knowledge. If there are too many applicants to interview, perhaps Rotarians could meet with the school principal/counselor to cull the group to a manageable number. The interview is also a good time to verify the student's schedule is clear for RYLA and that the student definitely has an interest. In addition to selecting the number of students your club has budgeted for RYLA, a number of alternates should be selected. Drop-outs are possible, and a good group of alternates minimizes this risk. We recommend each club select one or two alternates.
5. After selections have been made, prompt phone calls to the selected students and their parents should follow.
6. VERY IMPORTANT!!! Once your club has selected the student to attend RYLA, send the RYLA Application to the prospective RYLArian.
7. Mail or Fax the application for each selected student to RYLA Chair so official "award" letters can be sent. It is not necessary to send the application of alternates unless one of your students drops out.

Code of Conduct

In order for the RYLA staff to concentrate on delivering a program of leadership and character development, free enterprise, and patriotic values, they must be free of concerns about behavior problems among the RYLA attendees. RYLA is only four days and the volunteers staffing the camp do not have the time or interest in managing boys/girls who do not wish to be in camp or have no appreciation for the RYLA experience. The following behavior traits are not found in good leaders, and in this spirit, will not be tolerated in camp. Failure to follow these rules will be grounds for dismissal from RYLA, which will require transportation home at the parent's/guardian's expense.

1. Cheating/Dishonest behavior - Whether as an individual or as your team in competitions, cheating will not be tolerated.
2. Disregard for Authority - Constant questioning or arguing about the rules of camp, tournaments, etc., cannot be tolerated. We will not change the rules for you or your team.
3. Intimidation of Others - This refers to how you react to other campers and teams. If you can't get along with others without being the "top dog" or you tend to be a poor loser, perhaps RYLA isn't for you. True leaders rise to the top without threats or inconsiderate actions.
4. Disrespect - You only get to be at RYLA for four short days. Have fun, but be respectful of others at camp, especially the speakers. Talking during a speaker's presentation will not be tolerated.
5. Rudeness - Inappropriate comments on another's race, religion, athletic ability, character, looks, etc., will not be tolerated as they do not contribute to a positive RYLA experience.
6. Lateness - Be on time and have your team present on time. We don't start meals until everyone shows up. Our speakers frequently are on a tight schedule and shouldn't have to wait for us.
7. No P.D.A. (public display of affection) between couples. Couples are not permitted to be off alone, daylight or dark.
8. Sleeping arrangements are same-sex youth in a cabin with an adult same-sex Rotarian to serve as cabin monitors. Room assignments are made by staff in an effort to maximize your opportunity to make new friends. Changing of room assignments is not permitted without prior approval by the RYLA staff.
9. Outgoing calls may only be made through approval of a RYLA counselor. A 24-hour, 7 days a week telephone number is available for any incoming **emergency** calls. **(850-623-6197 or 800-239-6864). There is no cell phone use allowed during RYLA. No texting or cell use allowed. RYLA chairs can be reached at 850-380-0465 depending on reception.**
10. Any other behavior which makes you a liability instead of an asset to RYLA. You were selected to attend RYLA because someone knew you are a leader among your peers. Even if **you** aren't aware of your leadership potential, act like it's there and let us help you develop it.

I understand the above guidelines and intend to have as much fun as possible at RYLA without violating any of the above guidelines.
