

Pinellas Park HS:

Kenny Huynh is a senior in the First Responders Magnet Program. This program has inspired him to pursue a career in the medical field. He plans to attend the UF to become a Doctor.. He is a 2nd-generation refugee from Vietnam. He intends to become the first male in his family to graduate high



school and attended college. He holds a 4.0 unweighted GPA, a 4.51cumulative WGPA, and is ranked 4th out of 422 in his Class. He has taken 8 AP courses and 9 Dual Enrollment courses and is a recipient of the Florida Bright Futures Academic Scholarship. He is member of the Spirit Club, Varsity Academic Team, Model United Nations, Florida Future Educators of America, Key Club, Spanish Club, STEM Club, Science, Spanish, National Art, and National Honor Societies. He currently serves as Senator of Senior Student Gov't Assoc., President of Asian Student Assoc., President of Principals Multicultural Advisory Committee, VP of National English Honor Society, VP of Mu Alpha Theta, and VP of Rho Kappa. He founded an Asian Student Association at Dixie, and tutors both at school and at a local rec center. He hopes to be a Traveling Doctor to provide healthcare to individuals in rural locations.
