

Next Week's Program:

Program Chairman Buddy Brown will introduce Ned Barry, a fellow Rotarian and a Principal with McDonald & Barry Retiree Asset Management (MBRAM). Ned has twice served as President for two Rotary Clubs in Iowa. He is currently serving as Senior Staff with Seminar for Tomorrow's Leaders (S4TL) in Rotary multi-District 6890, 6950 and 6960. He is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow, Paul Harris Society Member, Major Donor, and Bequest Society Member.

In Florida, Ned has previously served as Rotary District 6950 Youth Protection Officer, Outbound Coordinator for the Youth Exchange



Committee, and as a member of the Technology Advisory Committee and Rotary Means Business Committee. He currently resides with his wife in Citrus Hills, Florida.



Ned will present a presentation on *Rotary's Guatemala Literacy Project (GLP).* Jim Plunkett has personally visited Guatemala, including rural Guatemala, on several occasions. Three out of four Mayans in rural Guatemala live in poverty on less than \$4 per day. In some rural regions two out of every three native Guatemalans cannot read or write. 62% of children never make it to middle school (grades 7-9) and 90% of rural middle schools are without any textbooks. Over 600 Rotary Clubs have participated in the *Guatemala Literacy Project* over the last 20+ years, and 184 clubs are currently participating.

Lesson Learned from the Rwanda Horrors:

Rwanda is a relatively small, land locked country in Africa. It is a country with few natural resources. In 1994, over 800,000 people were murdered by their government rulers. The initial strategy was to keep the people ignorant by having no public libraries and destroying all written records. This made it easy for government run news agencies to incite people to kill each other by appealing to their prejudices and disseminating misinformation, or "fake news" over social media. (sound familiar?)



As Michael Crichton wrote in his famous novel, Jurassic Park,
