**** Letter from our President, David Allen ****

Hello Pinellas Park Rotary Club:

Steve at Banquet Masters has assured us a safe return with servers & preparers wearing masks and gloves, a serving line with a plexiglass "sneeze" guard, limited seating at each table, and plated salads and desserts. With that, in-person meetings will resume on 6/18/20. (NEXT WEEK) We hope to also include Zoom participation for those **not ready to return.** I know everyone has not been together for a while, but **please** do not come if not feeling well, please maintain social distancing, and please refrain from **shaking hands.** It is important this go without incident for everyone's sake.

Last Week's Program:

Program Chairman Richard Breske presented an interesting program titled "Silver, Gold, Guns, Bullets, Whiskey and a Pound of \$50's. Richard talked about the effects of a possible national disaster, such as a hurricane, cyber attack or solar electromagnetic pulse. This type of disaster would likely render credit cards useless, as there would be no electric or network to monitor and record transactions. For this eventuality, Richard suggested keeping 100 each of the \$1, \$5, \$10 and \$20 monetary denominations (\$3,600 total), along with a "pound" of \$50's. He also



discussed the long term ramifications of the current Coronavirus national crisis. The National Debt is slated to increase by 12% this year alone. This could cause the following: (1) The cost of living to increase; (2) The value of the dollar to decrease, resulting in high inflation; (3) Since the dollar is such a world wide currency, this would cause a world-wide crisis.

The Argentine Peso was once equal to the American \$1. As a result of the above phenomena on a smaller scale in Argentina, that same peso is now worth about one and one half cents. Richard suggested that if you want to buy a gun, buy a stainless steel Revolver for availability of bullets and simplicity of use. Using a revolver requires practically no training. Richard suggests that the best way to prepare for the inevitable coming crisis is to buy Gold (worth about 96 times as much as silver), Silver, Guns and Bullets (you should have 100 rounds on hand minimum per gun that you purchase, as guns without bullets are useless), and Whiskey. All of these items are easily tradeable and do not spoil. This was one of the most important and useful presentations we have heard. Thank you, Richard for taking the time to put this together.












Next Week's Program:

Program Chairman Phil England will introduce Margo Adams-Reid, the Executive Director of the High Point Neighborhood Family Center. For 18 years, Margo has been the Executive Director of the High Point Neighborhood Family Center (HPNFC), a non-profit organization operating in unincorporated Clearwater. Prior to that she worked for twelve years at the Pinellas Juvenile Detention Center as a Supervisor and for five years as an Assistant Superintendent. She was also a certified "Use-of Force" instructor for the FDLE Dept. of Juvenile Justice Academy. The experience of the challenges she faced trying to help kids in the justice system, and the lessons she learned as a Mom (now Grandma) have shaped the work that she does at the HPNFC. Her mission was personal in building the HPNFC to improve the lives of kids and families. She, along with some wonderful High Point Community folks, built a program in a little house that is now a large facility and wonderful family center serving the community and the kids. The HPNFC was developed on the premise of Neighbors Helping Neighbors. The primary focus is on the youths in the community, but additionally, many of the services are geared towards stabilizing families so that everyone can thrive. In the recent months, the HPNFC has had to shift their services to more basic needs, with a focus on food, due to the severe economic Covid-19 impact.
