Last Week's Program:

Program Chairperson Harry Alchin introduced **Amy**, the Avian Hospital Technician for the *Seaside Seabird Sanctuary*, located at 18328 Gulf Blvd, on Indian Shores. The Sanctuary is a wildlife rehabilitation facility and tourist attraction that is dedicated to the rescue and treatment of sick and injured wild birds. The sanctuary has over 100 resident birds (these are injured birds who can no longer survive in the wild). The sanctuary treats about 4,000 birds per year, mostly Pelicans (hook and line injuries), Cormorants (red tide) and small birds (window strikes). Harry donated \$100 to the cause in Rotary's name.



The Sanctuary releases about 2,000 birds per year back into the wild. It has it's own beach behind the Sanctuary. Daily Pelican Feedings are at 2:30 pm, and private tours are available. Injured birds are treated at the Sanctuary, which has an x-ray machine. Major surgeries are referred to the bird hospital at Busch Gardens. The birds eat a

wide variety of things, including fruit, dog food, bird seed and fish. The Sanctuary has a 51% success rate in rehabilitating and returning birds to the wild, which is better than the 39% national average. Amy featured Sybil, a two pound Red Shore Hawk in her presentation. Sybil was hit by a car and can no longer make a complete flight, and therefore can no longer hunt. "Reading With Rufous" is a reading session for children conducted by Amy and featuring Rufous, a resident Eastern Screech Owl, every last Saturday of the month, from 11 am to 12 pm. The Sanctuary motto: **"Saving lives, ... one bird at a time."**

Program Chairperson David Allen will be presenting a program entitled, *"Recreational Vehicles Fellowship of Rotarians." (RVF)*

The RVF is one of many fellowships of Rotary in which members have a common bond. In RVF's case, that bond is a love for camping and rallies in various scenic locations in North America. Members include Rotarians from the US, Canada, Europe and Australia. David is a member of RVF, and encourages all Rotarians who have a love for camping, be it in a popup tent trailer or a Class A motorhome, to consider joining the group.

Next Week's Program:

Program Chairperson Ken Bray will introduce **Devon Francke**, the **Education Program Coordinator for Keep Pinellas Beautiful, Inc.(KPB)** KPB is the local **Keep America Beautiful** affiliate, and focuses on the education of national and global environmental issues that impact the Tampa Bay area. Among these concerns are the presence of plastics and microplastics in our waterways. KPB has created a Microplastics Program to educate Pinellas County citizens about the harm that plastic litter causes and what we can do to limit plastic pollution.
