introduced Michelle Walag from Ready for Life. She spoke to our club about the progress that they are making with the new phone system that we funded. Michelle also talked about their new "Pantry" program that they are working on with various local Rotary groups, as well as providing us with



updates on their other programs for Foster Youth. Our club has partnered with Ready for Life for over eight years.

Their program is currently assisting between 300 and 315 young people who have aged out of Foster Care after their 18th birthday. 82% of their participants are considered homeless, with the crisis worsening due to the pandemic.



Over 50% of Foster Care children do not finish High School, and those who leave Foster Care without having a "forever family" have a much higher likelihood than other children of becoming unemployed, incarcerated as adults, and/or homeless.


Almost 80% of the people currently on Death Row were once in Foster Care, which illustrates the need of every person to have a stable support system.

The goal of **Ready for Life** is to stabilize the crisis of aging out of Foster Care and improve the life skills of participants by holding training events, such as cooking classes. 36 of **Ready for Life** participants are currently taking or have completed college courses.
