Last Week's Program:

Program Chairperson Barbara MacKellar introduced her nephew, Milton Sheen, IV, the President and CEO of Suncoast Precision Tool and a former member of our club years ago. Suncoast Precision Tool is an industrial supplier who supplies materials to *H & S Swanson Tool* and companies like theirs around the world. His company was started by his grandfather, (Barbara's Dad) Milton Roy Sheen Jr. in 1963 out of his garage. When Milt IV started working for his grandfather



in 1982, the company was still working out of the garage. In 1995, they purchased their new building and in 2008, they moved into their current location. The company has weathered multiple downswings in the economy, including the recession in the 1990's. With the recession in 2008, just after they purchased their current building, their income dropped 75%. They laid off all but the essential workers, vacated all remote locations, consolidated their sales force and did a "business reset". That experience helped get them through these past few months. Luckily, they had already moved to a digital, on-line sales platform with their website that has given them more global exposure. Their most important employees used to be their salesmen, now it is their IT person. Their company has been using the internet for their sales for over 13 years now and that helped the company prepare for this recent slowdown. During this pandemic, they were designated an essential business allowing them to keep their business open. As more people have turned to the internet, their business has been booming. Their website afforded them visibility in the marketplace. Milt has a dedicated staff of 6 people. He feels automation and on-line exposure are crucial to survival in today's business world.

Former Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar:

Kristen Welker, last week's Presidential Debate Moderator is a White House Correspondent working for NBC News and MSNBC. She is the co-anchor of Weekend Today and the Saturday edition of the Today show. Kristen graduated from Harvard University with Honors and she spent a year in Madrid, Spain, as a Rotary Ambassador Scholar while majoring in Journalism.
