Program Chairperson Janet Waddell introduced Michelle Walag from Ready for *Life*, a solution-based skill center supporting youth in homelessness prevention, education and employment. RFL provides a lifeline support network as young adults age out of the Foster Care Program. Mentoring focuses on teaching them how to maximize their resources, including meal planning cooking classes as a lifelong skill including how to



prepare leftover meals, and eat healthy foods. Michelle talked about Ready for Life's mentoring program and what they are doing for the youth and young adults.
