We want to give every opportunity for elementary school age children & teenagers to read so that they can achieve success in life. Having tablets with headphones at the library will offer those who need to use the audiobooks and tablets access to thousands of digital eBooks through apps such as the Libby App & the 1-2-3- program, that are not available at the library

In a Dedication Ceremony on Thursday, February 11, 2021, our *Pinellas Park Rotary Club* donated \$10,100 worth of Instructional Technology to the *Barbara S. Ponce Pinellas Park Library* that includes: 2 - IPEVO White Board Systems, 4 Document Cameras, 2 Laptops, 25 Samsung Tablets, 20 Headphones 2 Projector Screens and a "Joey 30' Cart Charging Station for the tablets.
