Roslyn was born in Montreal, Canada to parents **John and Sonya Franken.** Her book portrays the true story of her parents, who were

both survivors of the atrocities of World War II, living on different sides of the globe.


Her mother miraculously survived multiple work/extermination camps including the Auschwitz Concentration (Extermination) Camp, during Nazi occupation and rule, and miraculously escaped death in the gas chambers three times.

Her father was a Prisoner of War in Imperial Japan, and miraculously survived the Nagasaki Atomic Bomb, by volunteering to work in the underground coal mines, and then being underground when the bomb struck. Roslyn is herself a cancer survivor, after being diagnosed at the age of 29 back in 1995. She presented her interesting talk on **Zoom**.


# RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE
