





The county also has many unincorporated areas that it serves.



There are 67 counties in Florida and Pinellas County is one of the safest. Each county has one county jail. Florida as a whole is experiencing a 50 year low in crime. Serious Crimes have been reduced by 43% since 2010, and auto theft is down by 37%. The State Prison System houses 79,000 inmates. Only about 12.5% of the people are incarcerated because of drug-related offenses. Of these,

86% have committed multiple felonies. Over 70% of the people housed in the Pinellas County jail are



pre-trial detainees. Sheriff Gualtieri has implemented a Criminal Justice Reform system that is becoming a model for the entire country with the idea being not to ruin a first or even second time offender's life for making a non-violent bad decision due to socio-economic reasons. Thanks to the Kiwanis Club for hosting our meeting. We look forward to having them as our guests again next year.
