Is your Club making a difference?

Over the years of being a Rotarian I have had the privilege of speaking to several International Presidents, whether I was at an International Convention, a Zone Summit, District Conference, or as your representative on the Council of Legislation. One Past International President I have had the privilege to talk to on several occasions is Cliff Dochterman. PRIP Cliff was our President in 1992-1993.

Cliff had a book published called **As I Was Saying**, a collection of favorite speeches and articles that had experienced in his lifelong journey as a true Rotarian. I would like to tell you about some of his messages to Rotarians around the World.

One of his chapters is "thinking of our future." Cliff says, "I often wonder how long Rotary International will survive as a World organization." The life expectancy of mankind today is about 80 years plus or minus. So, Rotary might be considered to be in the critical years. He wondered how many Rotarians are looking toward the future. Are too many Rotarians living in the past holding fast to the Rotary that used to be instead of concerning themselves about Rotary of the 21st century? How many clubs are prepared for the future of our organization? What is the character of your Rotary Club? Are your members more concerned with preserving its past rather than planning for its future?

What about your club members? Are you making the adjustments the changing society requires? The stagnant growth pattern of Rotary throughout the World is an early warning sign. It is an alert call for all clubs to take a look at what Rotary is doing and how Rotary is perceived in your community. So, I ask you what are you doing to make Rotary attractive to young business and professional leaders in your community?

What is the future of a club which finds it so much easier to write checks to other community groups than to put their own hands to work on a community service project?

What will happen to a club which seldom sees beyond its community borders and overlooks the amazing international service potential of our organization?

Rotary members and program participants are improving lives in communities around the world every day through thousands of service projects. Explore the good work that we are doing locally and globally and share these projects through social media.
